When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability (Acts 2:1-4).

In the story of Pentecost, the author of Luke-Acts gives focus and frame to the lives of Jesus' disciples. While there's no telling to whom the disciples will be sent, the ways in which the disciples will bear witness to the good news of Jesus, or how the disciples will be empowered, equipped, and surprised as they follow where Jesus leads, the Spirit's presence and power will be with them.

When the Spirit "calls, gathers, enlightens, and makes holy," as Martin Luther says, Jesus' disciples are crucified and raised, shaped and shaken for relationship with the wider world in ways that are authentic and vulnerable.

As we enter the summer months, we take a little bit of a rest from Bible studies, Sunday School, committee meetings and other gatherings, yet we still gather on Saturdays and Sundays, where bread is broken and wine is poured and we can encounter the risen Lord. We also begin reflecting and gearing up for the fall and how we will be church together for the sake of our community and for the world.

On the weekend of Pentecost, June 8 and June 9, the Rev. Dr. Ralph Jones, bishop of the Northwestern Pennsylvania Synod, will be with us at worship on that Saturday and Sunday as our preacher. It will most likely be his last time worshipping with the congregation at Holy Trinity before his retirement this summer.

Please plan to be with us at worship that weekend as we give thanks for his ministry to our synod over the last 18 years as bishop and look ahead to the new life God promises us as we make the transition to new leadership of our synod.

Our congregational meeting will be held on Sunday, June

23, after worship. We'll elect new council members and also get to hear the Rev. Michael Lozano, pastor of Christ Lutheran Church in Sharon, talk about how his congregation sent teenagers for the first time to the ELCA Youth Gathering in 2018. It will help us as we prepare to send our teenagers to Minneapolis for Youth Gathering in 2021.

In September, we look forward to joining in the ELCA's annual day of service, God's Work, Our Hands, on Sunday, September 8. Tens of thousands of Lutherans from thousands of congregations join in this day of service in their communities. We are now at work on planning how we can be a witness on that day in Greenville in showing our neighbors the love of God in Jesus Christ.

We pray that the Holy Spirit continue to blow around us, calling, gathering, enlightening and making holy.

The Day of Pentecost (Greek: "the fiftieth day.")

On Sunday, June 9, at 9:30 a.m. we will celebrate the Day of Pentecost, with pre-service music at 9:15 a.m. Pentecost is a principal festival of the church year, celebrating the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples fifty days after Easter (Acts 2:1-4).

In Judaism, the fiftieth day after Passover was celebrated as an agricultural festival, known as the Feast of Weeks (Exodus 34:22; Deuteronomy 16:9-10).

The Christian Pentecost was celebrated as a festival by the late fourth century.

Pentecost is the final day of the Easter season. This festival commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit and the Baptism of 3,000 converts. Red is the liturgical color of the day. All are encouraged to wear something red to worship this weekend.

Note: There WILL BE Saturday 5:30 p.m.



From our Director of Music

St. Columba

This is the second in a series of articles about <u>hymn tune names</u>, a category of hymns that can be found in the indices [Alphabetical Index of Tunes] of Evangelical Lutheran Worship, the red worship book that has been in use at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church since 2005, beginning on page 1195.

The hymn tune is <u>named</u> for St. Columba and was certainly not written by the Irish abbot [521-597], meaning neither tune, i.e. melody nor lyric was composed or written by St. Colm Cille [Irish]/ St. Columbkille [the PC Scottish] as sometimes thought by clergy and laity alike. St. Columba led a contingent of twelve companions – monks - to Scotland to convert the Picts to Christianity in 563. He founded the church at Iona and led other evangelical missions throughout the northern part of the British Isles before his death at Iona in 597. Supposedly, St. Columba was the first to observe the Loch Ness monster in 546.

The first article in this series stipulated that <u>hymn tunes</u> were and are most frequently named for a person or place; the last or 'sending' hymn sung at a recently attended hymn festival memorializing Paul Manz on his one hundredth birthday, May 17, 2019, bears this out as its hymn tune name is MANZ, the melody of which was composed by Paul Weber who also composed the setting sung throughout the Easter season at Holy Trinity.

The text of St. Columba, most familiarly known by the first line title 'The King of Love', is a paraphrase of Psalm 23 as revised by Henry F. Baker [1821-1877] whose version was described by John Ellerton [hymn composer and compiler of English hymnals 1826-1893] as "perhaps the most beautiful of...the countless versions of Psalm 23." [Hymnal Companion to Lutheran Book of Worship]. Marlowe Johnson, PhD., founder and conductor of the Thiel Choir, arranged stanzas 1, 3, and 5 of *St. Columba* and its melody as an anthem during his tenure at the college. This was sung by Parish Choir on the <u>fourth</u> Sunday of Easter, Good Shepherd Sunday, May 19, 2019 at Holy Trinity.

Second Mile Giving For June 2019 — ELCA Youth Gathering

The church council and finance committee are working to revise the Second Mile Giving list for 2019, but the two groups have committed to a conversation in the first part of this year about sending Holy Trinity's high school youth to the ELCA Youth Gathering in 2021.

Youth Gathering gathers about 30,000 of our youth from around the country every three years for a week of worship, learning and service opportunities. The Gathering in 2021 will be held in Minneapolis.

Those who have attended Youth Gathering have said that no one — not the teens or their adult leaders — comes home unchanged. It is an amazing experience in a life's faith journey.

Because Youth Gathering involves significant preparation in advance — the teens spend a lot of time together and the congregation would help with fund-raising — we will lift up Youth Gathering as a repeated emphasis in Second Mile Giving this year.
