### From our Pastor

Even Now, New Life

O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

We are in the midst of Lent, but are also busy making plans for Holy Week and Easter. We continue to plan for full Holy Week activities in person. They will also be live-streamed.

Our Holy Week, Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday services might look slightly different than past years, as we continue to work on making in-person worship as safe as possible.

It's hard to believe that in March we will mark one year since we first suspended our in-person worship. We are thankful that we have been able to gather in-person on so many weeks since then, even while we continue to offer live-streamed worship for those who do not yet feel safe in returning to the church.

When we had to send our annual report to the ELCA in February, it was the first time that we compiled our attendance numbers for 2020. Using a formula given to us by the ELCA, we calculated that the average number of people attending our services online each week was about 450. Our highest attendance online was for Palm Sunday and Easter. We calculated that about 2,000 people attended live or watched the recording of those services.

For some of those services, we were in partnership with other congregations, but we had increased attendance even on routine summer Sundays when we had all returned to holding in-person worship in our individual churches. We think this reveals a deep hunger in people to hear God's word and participate in some way with our congregation. Many of these people we do not know, but we hope and pray that through our ministry, these people have come to know God's word and God's grace.

While there are tragedies we have experienced in the midst of pandemic over the last year, we need to also recognize the blessings we have been given. We have been able to continue to offer worship, in some form, uninterrupted. The Lord's Day has continued to be given over to the Lord.

New life, resurrection life, can be made known to us in many ways. As we continue in this holy season of Lent, we remain mindful of the new life happening in our midst.

The class will be held at 2 p.m. We'll meet in the Roth Library.

As we look ahead to the end of March, we are planning for in-person worship every day during Holy Week, which begins on March 27-28 with our Palm Sunday services.

Friday, April 2, 7:00 p.m. — Good Friday

Saturday, April 3, 8:00 p.m. — The Great Vigil of Easter

Sunday, April 4, 9:30 a.m. — Celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ

We are planning to live-stream services on Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday evening, Good Friday, the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday.



### No Altar Flowers During Lent

As we prepare at the end of February to enter the penitential season of Lent, we remind you that we will have no flowers on the altar during the season. There will instead be a grouping of plants in the chancel area, a visual reminder that, with Jesus, we have entered the wilderness for 40 days.

### Lent at Holy Trinity

We will try to adhere as closely as possible to our Lenten traditions at Holy Trinity this year, while adapting where we must because of the pandemic. We are expecting (and praying) that we will be in-person for those services. For all in-person worship, masks and continuing to maintain physical distance are mandatory.

#### **Services of Holy Communion**

We will continue to celebrate our principal weekend liturgies of the Eucharist on Saturdays at 5:30 p.m. and Sundays at 9:30 a.m. There will also be small gatherings for the celebration of the Eucharist for those who do not feel comfortable in the larger gatherings. Those will be held on Wednesdays during Lent immediately after the service of Evening Prayer at 6:15 p.m., and on Thursday mornings at 10 a.m.

#### **Morning Prayer**

We will **NOT** be gathering at the church to pray Morning Prayer on weekdays during Lent. However, one member of the congregation will pray Morning Prayer at the church each day on our behalf. Because we typically pray for every member of the congregation by name during Lent at these services, we have created a simplified order of Morning Prayer for you to pray at home every day. See that order, and the list of names for each day, elsewhere in this newsletter.

#### **Wednesday Evening Prayer and Lenten Study**

We do not believe it is possible to safely hold the usual Wednesday soup suppers, so we will not host those this year.

We WILL gather for Evening Prayer at 6:15 p.m. in the sanctuary. Because we have had a daily Eucharist scheduled for Wednesday evenings since June, a brief distribution of Holy Communion will occur at the conclusion of Evening Prayer for those who wish to remain in the church.

We will also have a Lenten study at 7:15 p.m. Pastor Brenda will hold the study in-person at the church for a small number of people who attend Evening Prayer and prefer to remain in the church. The study will also be available via Zoom for those who feel safer gathering in that way. If you would like to participate via Zoom, please contact the church office so that we can email you the Zoom link.

The study this year will be on the Luther writing, "Freedom of the Christian." Last year was the 500th anniversary of the publication of "Freedom of the Christian," and we will explore what it

means for those of us who usually think about "freedom" as the freedoms we enjoy as citizens of a Western democracy, and compare that to what it means to be freed in Christ.

#### Stations of the Cross

We will not gather in person to pray Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings. We will, however, have Stations of the Cross available on our YouTube channel at <a href="https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCamdlF705R3knw7NEksvFxg">https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCamdlF705R3knw7NEksvFxg</a>. You can pray Stations on Friday evenings by using the posting on that channel.



# Sunday Church School Lenten Project 2021 - Calling All Bunnies!



The Parish Education Committee is requesting participation from the congregation in our SCS Lenten Project.

For the Good Shepherd Center's Easter basket distribution this year, we will again be collecting chocolate bunnies. The response to this effort last year was terrific, and feedback from GSC indicates that the bunnies were much appreciated by the kids who received them! We ask that the bunnies be medium-sized, preferably 6 oz. Having a uniform size helps make the preparation of the baskets a little easier for GSC staff.

Bunnies can be brought in, starting on Ash Wednesday (February 17) and placed on tables which will be located as usual at two spots – in the narthex, and in the administrative hall near the back alley door. We will need to have all bunnies collected by **Tuesday, March 23**, in order for GSC to have them in time for the Easter basket distribution dates.

At the time this announcement is being submitted, we are not certain whether we will be worshiping in-person when Lent begins, or still engaging in virtual participation. Please adhere to all COVID-safe practices that HTLC has in place, whether dropping off bunnies during worship, or at other times during the week.

### Lent Morning Prayer during COVID Times

Because of the pandemic, members of our congregation won't be gathering together in person every weekday morning to pray Morning Prayer. There will be one person praying at the church each day, on behalf of the congregation. During Lent, we typically pray by name for every person in our congregation. We ask you to join with us this year, at home, with this abbreviated prayer service, adding the names appointed for each day.

### From Our Director of Music

An organ piece titled Tiento (Care) was heard during distribution at the 7:00 p.m. Ash Wednesday service on February 17. The composer, Johannis (Juan) Cabanilles (1644-1712) sparked interest and the following information ensued: Johannis (Dutch spelling) of Juan Cabanellis began singing in the choir of Valencia Cathedral before entering the priesthood there. As a novitiate, part of his schooling included music lessons, specifically organ lessons. At age 20, on May 15, 1665, he was appointed Assistant Organist until a year later when he was promoted to Principal Organist. On September 22, 1668 he was ordained but continued as Principal Organist until his death in 1712. Most of Cabanilles' compositions are stored in the Biblioteca de Catalyana in Barcelona including passacagi, toccati, and TIENTI.

### Reformed: Always Reforming Group to Meet

Our Reformed: Always Reforming group went on hiatus in December when we suspended in -person worship as Covid-19 numbers in Mercer County became more dire.

Now that the threat has eased and we have returned to in-person worship, the group will begin to meet again. The next meeting will be Sunday, March 14, at 1 p.m. The meeting will take place downstairs in Brath Hall.

### Project Generosity: We're Sharing Our Building

Project Generosity is our year-long stewardship emphasis in which we will lift up the generosity that we see in the world around us.

When the COVID-19 pandemic starting to hit close to home in Mercer County a year ago, our congregation council made the decision that even if we closed our building to in-person worship, we wanted to make the building available for community use if necessary, even if that meant opening our building as overflow space if the hospital became full or if feeding ministries became overwhelmed in their current spaces.

While that didn't happen, our building has had increased use in the past year because of the pandemic. As other institutions closed off their space to outside groups in the past year, we have offered our space to outside groups when we have been able to do so safely. We require groups to follow the same safety guidelines we use about wearing masks and keeping physical distance. We've also been able to schedule groups in various parts of the building at different times so there is no overlap. That allows us to keep the building clean.

We continue to host multiple AA groups several times a week, as we always have. We are now hosting a GED class several nights a week, an important ministry to those trying to get their high school diplomas. We've also hosted a multi-week Medicare class and safe driving classes for seniors.

Because we have Wi-Fi available in the building, we've opened the church to college students, high school students and workers who need Wi-Fi access to take classes or do their jobs. Some people don't have stable internet access at their homes, especially in more rural areas. And even the best Wi-Fi can become unstable. For those who wake up in the morning expecting to go to class or a work meeting, then find out their internet isn't working, the church can offer space to you so that you can use the Wi-Fi here.

It's one way during the pandemic that we have been able to offer a gift to our community to help serve our neighbors in a new and different way.

### A Note about the Sound on Our Live-Streamed Worship

We know that some of you have had difficulty hearing portions of the liturgy on livestreamed worship, and we continue to try to work with our existing sound system to make the experience better.

We have discovered, however, that some of the problems with sound depend on the device that you are using to participate in worship.

On a recent Sunday, Pastor Brenda tested the recorded worship on four different devices at home – a phone, iPad, laptop computer and television. She found that the phone was good, the iPad didn't pick up sound at all, the computer was OK and the television was great.

Here's a hint: If you ever use Amazon to watch shows on television, you should be able to find our worship on Sunday mornings. If you'd like to know how, let Tammy know in the church office and she'll have Pastor Brenda walk you through how to find us on Amazon.

# Second Mile Giving for March - Greenville Area School District Backpack Program

Each month, we offer the opportunity for our members to reach out into the greater community to those who are seeking to minister to people with specific needs, through our Second Mile Giving – our financial gifts beyond our regular offerings.

In April, we are seeking to help the **Backpack Program** for Greenville Area School District Elementary Students through Christian Fitness Ministries.

#### Backpack Program

The Backpack Program is a nationwide program of <u>Feeding America</u>, which is coordinated locally by the Community Food Warehouse. Through a partnership between Christian Fitness Ministries, <u>Community Food Warehouse</u>, and <u>Greenville Area School District</u>, this program will be made available for elementary (K-6) students who meet eligibility requirements.

**Purpose:** The Backpack Program meets the needs of hungry elementary (K-6) children

of the Greenville Area School District by providing them with nutritious and easy-to-prepare food to take home on weekends and school vacations when

other resources are not available.

**Who:** Elementary children enrolled in Kindergarten through Grade 6 who meet

eligibility criteria for determining chronic hunger. (Participation is optional)

What: Food for 4 meals, including 100% fruit juice, shelf-stable milk, cereal, fruit

cups, protein entrees, and healthy snacks.

**How:** Food packs are assembled by a team of volunteers and delivered to the

schools and discreetly placed into the student's backpack on Friday (or the last

day before a school vacation) by school designated personnel.

Cost: \$25.00 per child per month for 9 months. (\$225.00

per child per year)

Second Mile envelopes can be found in the pew racks, or you may mail your contribution to the church office in an envelope clearly marked, "Second Mile Giving." All Second Mile contributions received during the month will be given to the designated cause.





# A Reminder: Let Us Know When Someone Is Hospitalized

If you or someone you know has been hospitalized, please let the church office or the pastor know.

Many people assume that nursing homes or hospitals alert the church when someone is being treated. Because of the laws surrounding privacy (known as HIPAA), organizations have been required for a number of years now to honor your privacy in releasing information. Even if we call a hospital and ask if someone is being treated, hospitals are not allowed to tell us.

When you share information with us, it allows us to offer pastoral care, deliver flowers from the Sunday altar, and visit and pray with people when they're not feeling well. Thank you for helping us in this ministry of the church.


