# Holy Saturday The Vigil of Easter

The Church began to celebrate her redemption on Maundy Thursday and continued through Good Friday. In this Vigil of Easter, all that has gone on before is reversed: darkness turns to light, mourning becomes great joy, our waiting merges into a present reality.

This vigil is a celebration in four distinct parts. First, NEW FIRE is kindled and carried into the darkened church with the Paschal Candle, and the light is spread throughout the congregation for the Easter Proclamation, the deacon's Exultet. A liturgy of READINGS, from the prophecies to God's final saving deed in Jesus the Christ, follows the service of light. The blessing of water for HOLY BAPTISM, and the affirmation of our baptismal vows (and sprinkling) all celebrate the identity of the Christian as one with Christ's passover from Death into Life. Luther's litany is sung while the church is prepared for the celebration of the HOLY EUCHARIST. The Light of Christ has completely lighted up the darkness of our lives.

The Church of Christ asks us this night to wait, to exult, to praise, to proclaim, and finally to become one with and celebrate the Victory of the Lord of Life. So far-reaching is our joy, that Christians greet one another during this night, and for the great Fifty Days, until Pentecost, with the words "CHRIST IS RISEN!" and return the greeting "HE IS RISEN INDEED!"



The congregation is asked to gather in the Library/Lounge until the time of the Vigil. **Please take a worship booklet and a candle.** After a brief explanation of the liturgy, the ministers will lead the congregation to the front steps (weather permitting) for the beginning of the Vigil. Please keep the silence, for this is indeed a Holy Night! Each member of the congregation, upon entering the nave, will receive light taken from the Paschal Candle. Please pass the light, **tipping only the unlighted candle**.

# Service of Light

(When the assembly has arrived at the place of the new fire the presiding minister and the assembly greet each other.)

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

And also with you.

(The new fire is struck from flint and steel.)

Let us pray.

Eternal God, in Jesus Christ you have given the light of life to all the world. Bless this new fire, and increase in us a desire to shine forth with the brightness of Christ's rising, until we feast at the banquet of eternal light; through the Sun of righteousness, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

(The presiding minister traces the inscription on the paschal candle, which is held by the deacon.)

Christ, yesterday and today,

(Trace the sign of the cross.)

the beginning and the ending.

(Trace the Greek letters Alpha and Omega.)

To Christ belongs all time

(Trace the first numeral.)

and all ages;

(*Trace the second numeral.*)

(The Paschal Candle is lit from the New Fire.)

The light of Christ, rising in glory,

Dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.

The procession forms, led by the thurifer (bearing incense) and the deacon carrying the Paschal Candle. Incense is a mixture of pine and other resins burned for use in worship. Its use in the church is traced to the 4th century. One of several meanings of incense use is: a sign of honor rendered to God, God's people, and holy things (e.g. Paschal Candle, altar, communion elements). The assembly follows the cantor/choir in procession. All move in silence to the entrances of the church. DURING THE PROCESSION LIGHT FROM THE PASCHAL CANDLE WILL BE PASSED UNTIL THE PEOPLE'S CANDLES ARE ALL LIGHTED.)


During the procession the deacon will stop and sing three times, each time on a higher pitch, with the assembly responding:




The congregation remains standing for the Easter Proclamation (Exultet), sung by assisting ministers.

### **Baptism**

P: God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. The power of sin is put to death in this holy flood, and we are raised with Jesus Christ to new life. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and sent out in mission for the life of the world.

(Sponsor present the candidates for Holy Baptism.)

S: I present Brian William for Baptism.


(The presiding minister addresses the candidates.)

- P: Brian William, called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to be baptized in Christ?
- R: I do.

(The presiding minster addresses sponsors.)

- P: Sponsor, do you promise to nurture Brian William in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help him live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the Church?
- R: I do.

- P: People of God, do you promise to support Brian William, and pray for him in his new life in Christ?
- R: We do.





Holy God, mighty Lord, gracious Father: we give you thanks, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and you created heaven and earth. By the gift of water you nourish and sustain us and all living things. By the waters of the flood you condemned the wicked and saved those whom you had chosen, Noah and his family. You led Israel by the pillar of cloud and fire through the sea, out of slavery into the freedom of the Promised Land. In the water of the Jordan your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Spirit. By the Baptism of his own death and

resurrection, your beloved Son has set us free from the bondage to sin and death, and has opened the way to the joy and freedom of everlasting life. He made water a sign of the kingdom and of cleansing and rebirth. In obedience to his command, we make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, (+) and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, so that those who affirm their baptism may be renewed in life. Wash away the sin of all those who are renewed and cleansed by this water and bring them forth as inheritors of your glorious kingdom.

To you be given praise and honor and worship, through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.



- D: Sisters and brothers in Christ, through the paschal mystery we have been buried with Christ in Baptism, so that we may rise with him to a new life. Now that we have completed our Lenten observance, let us affirm the promises we made in Baptism when we rejected Satan and his works, and promised to serve God faithfully in his Holy Church. And so I ask you, as you were asked at your Baptism, to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the Church, the faith in which we baptize.
- D: Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God? I renounce them!
- D: Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? I renounce them!
- D: Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? I renounce them!

As the Apostles' Creed is confessed in response to the questions, water from the font is sprinkled by the Presiding Minister upon the assembly in remembrance of their baptism.

(The Deacon addresses the assembly.)

- D: Do you believe in God the Father?

  I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
- D: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

  I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,
  who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,
  born of the virgin Mary,
  suffered under Pontius Pilate,
  was crucified, died, and was buried;
  he descended to the dead.
  On the third day he rose again;
  he ascended into heaven,
  he is seated at the right hand of the father,
  and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

#### Presentation of the Baptismal Candle

(A lighted candle is given to the baptized.)

D: Let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

#### Acclamation

(The ministers and the newly baptized face the assembly.)

D: Let us welcome the newly baptized into the household of God, the priesthood of all believers.

(The assembly addresses the newly baptized.)


- A: We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share. Join us as we give thanks and praise to God and bear God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.

- C: Amen.


All return to their seats. The assembly will have hand candles lighted for use throughout the litany.
