Brothers and sisters in Christ,

We are in the early weeks of our Lenten pilgrimage, moving toward the great Feast of Easter and its promise of new life. This isn't a promise we need to wait until the end of the month to experience; we're experiencing it even now as the early spring flowers start to break through the dirt of winter and we're expected to enjoy our first 60+-degree day.

As we continue our walk through the 40 days of Lent this month, we are in the midst of this great paradox: Lent holds together our human experience of living as people of the covenant, heirs of the people with whom God made promises so many generations and thousands of years ago.

We hear of those promises every week of our Lenten journey this year.

Lent is the time for the renewal of our baptismal covenant. We've already heard in our Lenten Sundays so far of God's covenant with Noah and the animals, then of God's covenant with Abraham and Sarah. By faith we join in this covenant, which calls us to follow Christ to the cross and into the resurrection.

We return, again and again, to the covenant of baptism, the promises made with water that we will be renewed, refreshed and reborn in our life in Christ.

Blessings to you, dear church, as you live in, under and with this covenant in these 40 days of Lent and in all the days of your life.



Coming in May: Lutheran Day at the Capitol

Each year, Lutherans gather at the state Capitol building in Harrisburg to meet with their legislators and advocate for legislation that supports the least among us, those people who are favored by Jesus.

It's called Lutheran Day at the Capitol, and it's scheduled for Thursday, May 9. Lutheran Day is sponsored by the organization called Lutheran Advocacy Ministry in Pennsylvania. This year's Lutheran Day at the Capitol is a special one, as it celebrates the 45th anniversary of LAMPa. The anniversary will be marked at a gala on the night of May 9.

The agenda of LAMPa is set each year by LAMPa's policy council, made up of Lutheran pastors and lay people. One of Pennsylvania's bishops serves on the policy council on a rotating basis. Pastor Brenda has served on the policy council since 2019, and is currently serving as chair of the policy council. Her term ends in fall of 2025.

Pastor Brenda is hoping to fill a table at the gala with people from northwestern Pennsylvania. If you have an interest in attending Lutheran Day at the Capitol, then the gala celebrating LAMPa's history, please contact her. Lent and Easter

We continue our journey through Lent as we enter March, and even though it seems Lent has just begun, we will also celebrate Easter in March, on March 31.

During Lent, we continue to offer:

Morning Prayer, Mondays through Fridays at 8:30 a.m. in the choir pews in the chancel.

Evening Prayer (Vespers), on Wednesdays at 6:15 p.m. in the sanctuary. At this quiet, midweek, traditional vespers service, our prayers rise as incense as we enter the quiet of the night.

Lenten Study will take place during our Thursday Happy Hour Zoom. If you would like to participate, please contact the church office so that we can email you the Zoom link and make sure you have the materials for the study.

Stations of the Cross will be prayed on Fridays at 5:30 p.m. in the sanctuary. Please enter through the office door. For those who would like to pray Stations from home, our recording of Stations of the Cross from 2020 is available on our YouTube channel at https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCamdlF705R3knw7NEksvFxg.

Holy Week will include Vespers on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday evenings at 7 p.m., Maundy Thursday services on Thursday, March 28, at 12:10 p.m. and 7 p.m., Good Friday service on Friday, March 29, at 7 p.m., and the Great Vigil of Easter, the first service celebrating Jesus' resurrection, on Saturday, March 30, at 7:30 p.m. This year, our synod's bishop emeritus, the Rev. Dr. Ralph Jones, will be out guest preacher.

The **Resurrection of our Lord** will be celebrated Sunday, March 31, at 9:30 a.m.


Your donation may be made in celebration of, in memory of, or in honor of a person (s) or an event. (Amounts given are not listed in the bulletin.)
