Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

We begin a new month having celebrated the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, stepping out with good courage into the season of Eastertide.

I've been thinking recently about this prayer that we have prayed at nearly every Eucharist since March of 2020, when Covid Times began and we were plunged into uncertainty, not knowing how it would all end.

Here we are, four years later, and this prayer has become so meaningful to so many people. It's become a prayer not just for Covid Times but for all times, for all paths, for all ventures. You've shared it with people in your lives who you think might need it at a particular time for particular reasons. You've prayed it yourselves as you've watched loved ones pass from this life to the next, as you've weathered health storms and the strife of the world around us, as you've handled transitions in jobs and in kids getting ready to leave the nest and walk into their own new ventures.

We've prayed to be given faith to go out with "good courage," and I've been pondering what that means, "good courage." I didn't know how to define it except by what might be its opposite, "bad courage." That would be the courage that is manufactured, that we try to draw out of ourselves and put on our faces, even when we have no courage at all.

"Good courage," then, must not come from ourselves, but from a gift given to us, as faith is a gift given to us. Walking into the un-



known with "good courage" means walking with the faith that we're never going into new ventures and on new paths alone, but with the accompaniment of the God who created and redeemed us, whose hand leads us and whose love supports us.

Blessed Easter, dear church. Walk into this new month, this Eastertide, with good courage.

Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

### Final push for fundraising for Youth Gathering

We are hoping to complete fund-raising by mid-May.

We are **created** to be brave, to show up with an open mind and heart, willing to be challenged.


We are **created** to be authentic, to bring our whole selves and know that we are loved by our Creator.

### From Our Director of Music

On Sunday evening, April 28 at 4:00 p.m. we are very pleased to open our 2023/24 Friends of Music Season with a performance by the Greenville High School Chamber Singers.

Led by Claire DeArmitt, the Greenville High School Chamber Singers is an auditioned vocal ensemble of 14-20 students from GHS, including our very own Hannah McKinney, and is the top singing group at the school. The students, ranging from grades 9 through 12, are selected based on participation in the GHS Senior High Choir, a non-auditioned choir, as well as their level of musicianship and ability to sing in a small ensemble setting. In addition to their performances in school concerts, the Chamber Singers maintain a busy performance schedule, having sung in various venues such as the Mercer County Courthouse, Fresh Grounds Coffee House, the Chapel at Thiel College, the Greenville Senior Center, Buhl Park, and even the Brooklyn Public Library in NYC. The Chamber Singers are thrilled to be singing for the first time in the beautiful sanctuary of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church. Their choral selections include works by Rollo Dilworth, Stephen Sondheim, C. V. Stanford, Ryan Main, Jim Papoulis, Rodgers & Hammerstein, Stephen Paulus, Sara Bareilles, and more.

Their director, Claire DeArmitt, is a mezzo-soprano and teacher from Bellwood, Pennsylvania. She is a performer across various genres, including opera, musical theatre, pop, and concert repertoire. Most recently, she has performed as the alto soloist in Mozart's *Requiem* with the Pennsylvania Chamber Orchestra and the role of Domina in *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum*. Ms. DeArmitt is currently the choral and theatre director at Greenville High School in Greenville, PA, and is on the voice faculty at Grove City College. She also maintains a private voice studio in Greenville and Hermitage, PA. Ms. DeArmitt holds a Master of Music in Voice Pedagogy and Performance from Penn State and a Bachelor of Music in Music Education from Grove City College.

Please join us on Sunday, April 28 at 4:00 p.m. for this exciting program of sacred and secular choral music presented by a very outstanding local choral group. In May, the Friends of Music will present an Organ & Brass

concert with Steve Repasky and members of the Warren Brass Ensemble. In the Fall we will have a



Progressive Organ Recital starting at St. Clement's Episcopal Church and then moving to Holy Trinity. St. Clement houses a restored late 19th-century mechanical action organ that is seldom played. In the Fall we will also welcome the choir Illuminare, who sang at our church last year along with other fine musical ensembles.


### Good Shepherd Request for April
