First, thank you. Thank you for supporting the effort to send a group from Holy Trinity to the ELCA's Youth Gathering for the first time. Thank you for donating your time and your money. A Reminder: Let Us Know When Someone Is Hospitalized

If you or someone you know has been hospitalized, please let the church office or the pastor know.

Many people assume that nursing homes or hospitals alert the church when someone is being treated. Because of the laws surrounding privacy (known as HIPAA), organizations have been required for a number of years now to honor your privacy in releasing information. Even if we call a hospital and ask if someone is being treated, hospitals are not allowed to tell us.

When you share information with us, it allows us to offer pastoral care, deliver flowers from the Sunday altar, and visit and pray with people when they're not feeling well. Thank you for helping us in this ministry of the church.

Vacation Bible School With A Twist

Ah, Summer! That time of year when you can't pass a church in Greenville and not see a sign for Vacation Bible School. Well, most churches that is. There are some churches (like Holy Trinity) that do not have Vacation Bible School for a number of very good reasons: kids' calendars are booked during the summer; family vacations; traditional church school teachers (and students) need a break; it's too hot; etc., etc. We were trying to remember the last time Holy Trinity hosted such an event in the summer when a crazy idea started to bloom. Because we couldn't remember when, we decided how about now? So, we are putting together a Vacation Bible School to take place next month. But before you start to round up the munchkins, there is a twist to our proposal. Our Vacation Bible School is for Grown Ups! Yup, you read that right. We are still working out the logistics for that but hey, if we can pull off a winter indoor yard sale the sky's the limit, right?


Upon returning from vacation, turn in your worship bulletin from the church you visited while away so we may add you to our Trinity Travelers list.
