**Welcome to all on this holy night!** We extend a special greeting to those visiting with us to join in the celebration of the Savior's birth. May the love, mercy, and peace of God revealed in Jesus Christ be yours always. Have a blessed Christmas!

**Invitation to Communion:** Holy Communion is the body and blood of Jesus Christ by which our Lord is truly present to forgive sin and bring life and salvation. All baptized Christians who believe this promise are welcome to commune. Parents with children are encouraged to come forward together. Children who do not yet receive communion will receive the blessing of the Church from the Pastor.

**Procedure for Communing:** Come forward by the center aisle in two lines. Take a small glass from the tray held by the ushers. Receive the host from the presiding minister, alternating between left and right lines. You may receive the host either in your open palm or in your mouth. Move to the chalice bearer on your side, and receive the wine poured into the small glass. Return to your pew by the side aisle, placing your empty glass in the tray provided at the table in the aisle.

If you are unable to consume either the bread or wine, be assured that Christ is fully present for us in either element; reverence the body or blood of Christ by saying, "Amen" when the host or the chalice is presented.

**Gluten-free wafers are available; let Pastor know when you come forward to receive.**

**Candle-lighting:** When passing the light, *please tip the unlighted candle, never the lighted one.* Parents, use careful discretion whether children may safely use a candle. Extinguish all candles at the conclusion of the hymns. Take care of dripping wax. Candles will be collected by the ushers in the narthex.

**The Christmas Day Holy Communion** is tomorrow morning at 9:30 a.m. Celebrate Christ's birthday in worship!

Welcome in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Please gather in silence and prepare for worship. Remember to turn off cell phones. Thank you.

was born in Bethlehem of Judea of the Virgin Mary.


